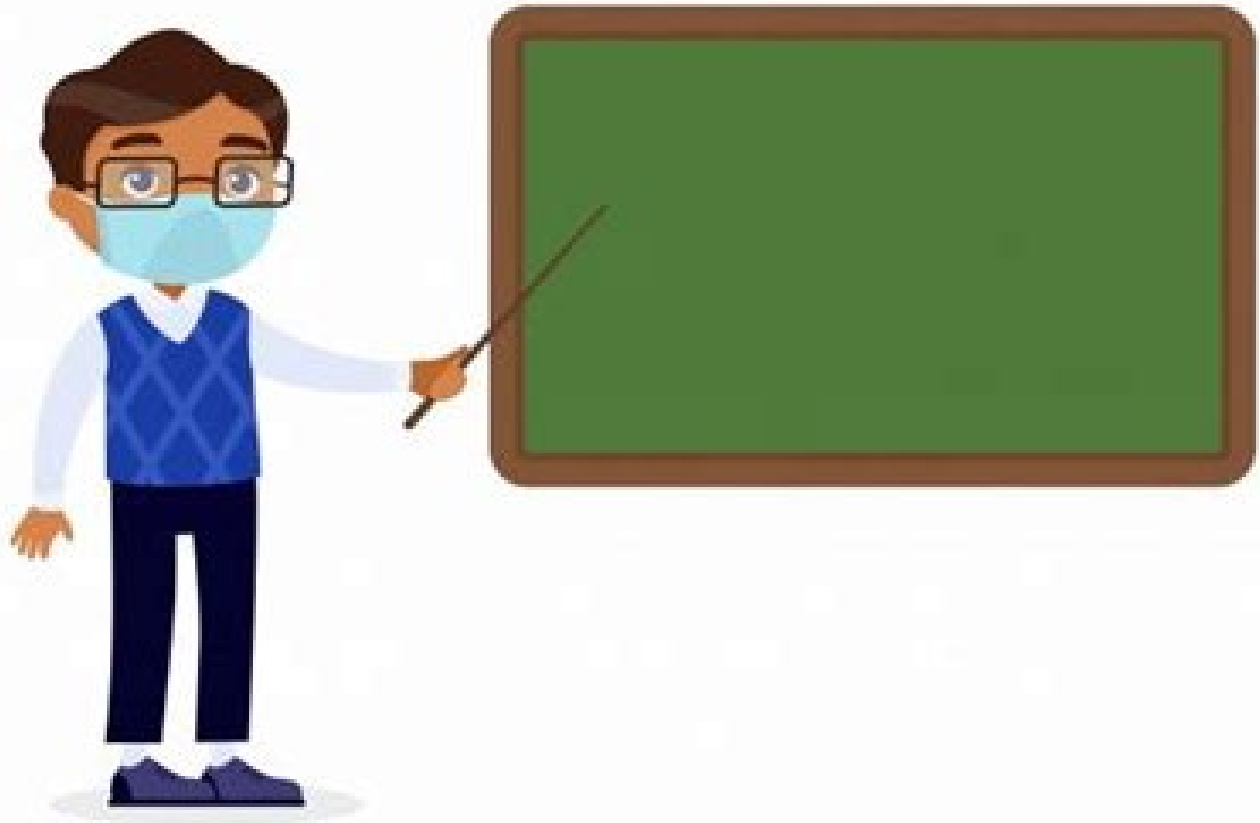


# How will school look like 'post Covid19' at BCA?

Scheduled hand washing breaks in addition to extra scheduled sanitizing of desks and work areas.

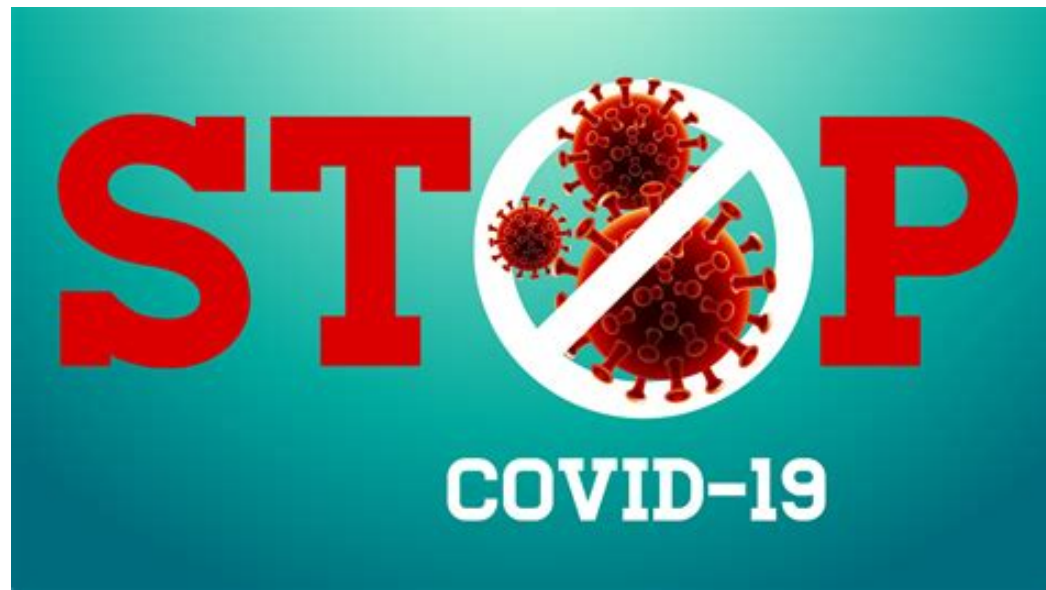

# How Did We Get Here?
